

The Committee Spotlight was the Duck Race Committee. Carol Reiser restated the 80/20% profit from ticket sales with 80% going to Philo.

Carol then introduced Chris White from the Loveland Rotary Club. Chris came dressed in a duck costume and entertained members with the song Rubber Ducky with Philo members singing the chorus.
