Thank You to Philo members who are helping to maintain the fiscal health of our organization in the time of this pandemic. Committee efforts for fund-raising through community activities are a challenge in this Philo year, yet progress has been made.

Thanks to the Early Childhood committee and their work with Barnes & Noble. We'll soon learn how much profit the committee will have from November online purchases of books and from individual donations.

Thanks to the Food Drive and Baskets committees for their Virtual Food Drive on our website, for the significant donation from DineOutWithHeart, and the Committee's willingness to purchase food gift cards from Safeway this year. The total amount spent on food gift cards was \$6,000, with Philo receiving a 4% rebate from Safeway.

Thanks to the Shopping Extravaganza committee and Marge McCoy for implementing a trial run of Shop With Scrip (SWS), where Gift Cards (cash cards) can be purchased, with Philo receiving a rebate from each of the purchases made. Within three weeks, the Philo General Fund received rebates totaling \$428. The Board and the Shopping committee will review this option for future use. If you want to know more about this fundraiser, go to ShopWithScrip.com to learn of online options beyond the purchase of cash cards.

Thank You to those who use individual King Soopers cards, connected to KS Community Rewards. We receive an average of \$200 per quarter for our General Fund from this program.

The Amazon Smile Foundation program was started by Philo in September. Currently we have only eleven (11) members who have signed up for AmazonSmile. Won't you join as well? We'll receive our rebate in February from Amazon purchases made September through December.

Participation in any of these programs does not cost any extra money given from your pocket. It is a way for retailers to donate back to our community.
