To the Editor:

I was quite interested in reading the article in the March issue of the ALUMNUS about early literary societies on your campus. My mother, Emma Greedy Van Sant (Mrs. H. T. Van Sant), was a student at Drake about 1890, along with several of her sisters, Lillie, Harriet, and Jessie Greedy. My mother belonged to the Philomathian group.

In 1918 my mother organized and named a club here in Loveland. This club had its beginning from ten high school girls (including myself). Mother had this club (The Philomathian Club) join the Colorado Federation of Women's Clubs in which we have kept our membership. We have 75 members now (a limited membership because of our club room space). Charity and welfare work have become our chief aims—we do all the Christmas cheer baskets in this community as well as surrounding communities. Last year we spent \$1,200 on welfare work. We fixed and delivered 135 baskets to unfortunate children and families.

I hope I have not bored you with these details, but ever since I was a little girl I have heard of your early organizations from mother. I just felt as if I had to write to you and tell you how the name "Philomathian" is being honored in our community.
