History/Yearbook

For this month, I decided to go back 75 years to 1946-47. These are some items featured in the Philo scrapbook for that year. Looking back at this typical year, I realize how deeply embedded Philo has been in the history of Loveland.

The reference to a style show is the first mention of what became an annual fundraiser that ended in 1982. Ted Thompson is remembered, together with the postmaster and Loveland Stamp Club, for creating the Valentine Re-Mailing Program in 1946. The name, Mrs. Emma Van Sant, should also sound familiar since she is the mother who sponsored her daughter and friends to form the Philomatheon Club in 1918. An effort is now under way to preserve and reuse the Pulliam Building, once the venue for Philo style shows and other community events.

What will Philomatheons remember about us 75 years from now? The 2021-22 Annual Philo Yearbook will show how we continued past traditions and created some exciting new ones.

• The club voted to serve refreshments after each home football game to raise funds for the club work.

• The Elks Club donated a chicken for each Christmas basket to be distributed the day before Christmas according to the custom of the club for many years.

•Valentine's Day: "A delightful Valentine party was given by the members of Philo club, Tuesday evening, for their husbands. Stewart Case, who has charge of recreation at Colorado A & M College, arranged a varied and enjoyable program of games, contests, and square dances in which all participated with zest."

• Philo club entertained as a style show for members and guests, featuring new spring fashions from the Duff store.

• In April, Ted Thompson, president of the Chamber of Commerce, presented a program about new projects in Loveland. "Work is being done on improvements to the fairgrounds and development of the recreation center south of Loveland. Tourist trade should be greatly increased by the new airport. A survey of industries showed 12 up to 1941, while at the end of 1946 there were 36; new businesses have filled every available location."

• At the Mother's Day tea, Don Macy sang two vocal solos accompanied by Mrs. Harold Ferguson. At the refreshment table, Mrs. Garrett and Mrs. Emma Van Sant poured.

• August 23, 1947, Reporter-Herald: "The latest in fashions for fall were viewed by 630 persons who attended the autumn style show and revue at Pulliam auditorium Friday night when several Loveland firms united in presenting the event." Philo is not mentioned specifically, but the commentator, entertainers, and models were Philo members.

Applicants must be residents of the Thompson R2-J School District of any age, already accepted into a technical/vocational/two-year program for school year 2022-2023 and show financial need. Applicants also complete an essay, provide transcripts and letters of recommendation, and complete a personal interview. Scholarships this year will be for \$500 - \$3000 and we have \$12,000 to give out. Scholarship winners will be announced May 1, 2022.

Dine out with Heart

Although the Dine Out With Heart committee has been quiet, we've been busy ensuring this important fundraiser continues to evolve & provide much-needed support for those in our community who find themselves dealing with hunger. We've made significant changes over the past few years to address both an ongoing decrease in participation as well as the challenges presented with COVID. Despite these efforts, in addition to the generosity of both new & returning sponsors, overall donations continue to follow a downward trend.

Throughout the past 6 months of brainstorming, researching, & networking, our committee has decided instead of the usual 2-week event hosted at eateries around town to work with other local vendors to host a 1-day, 5-hour food truck rally on June 11. In order to make this possible, we're proud to announce 2 new sponsors offering significant in-kind donations!

LN2 Food Truck Events works with gourmet food trucks throughout NoCo. They will bring local vendors to join us with fees normally collected from the vendors for this event to be donated to the fundraiser & other organizing fees will be waived. Thunder Mountain Harley Davidson will be providing the venue to host the event, including many of the amenities an event like this normally requires, at no cost to DOWH!

These are both game-changing offers that will allow our committee to commit the funds raised through the event towards financial grants to address hunger rather than advertising & marketing, permits, electricity, porta-potties, picnic tables, sanitation & trash disposal, etc. We are also planning to offer entertainment through local musicians, artisans, & entertainers in addition to outreach opportunities for past non-profit grant recipients.

All of this is a departure from how we've typically run this fundraiser, so our committee is open to any suggestions, resources, or offers from others who would be interested in participating. We will also be looking for help during the event from Philo member volunteers. Please feel free to reach out & stay tuned for more information as we build the event & get closer to June.


