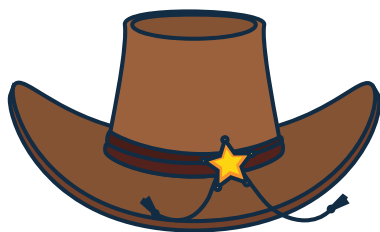
The Lazy P Stampede is almost here!

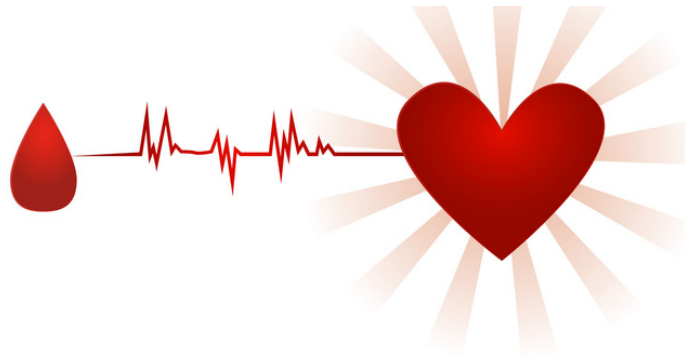

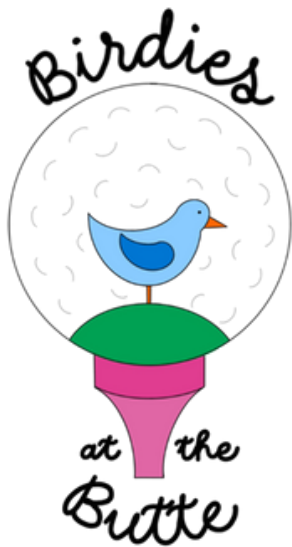

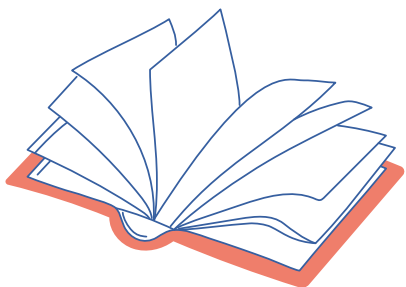
Scholarship

PHILO GENERAL MEETING, TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH, APRIL 12, 2022 at 7:00 p.m.

President Starck called the meeting to order and thanked tonight's hostesses – Mary Voggeser, Marthanne Dahlen, Diane Meuret, and Carol Rieser. Natalie Parker moved to accept the minutes of the March meeting as published in the recent newsletter. This motion was seconded by Ruth Sprain and passed.

Treasurer's Report:

General Fund	\$11,868
Golf/Scholarship Fund Raising	\$15,090
DineOutWithHeart Fund Raising	\$12,185
General Money Market	\$12,161 (.13 interest this past month)

All dues have been paid. We now have money coming in for the Spring Dinner (check, Square, or Zelle) and both of our Fundraising accounts (check or PayPal).

In this 3 month block of time, the shopping rebates we have received are:

Amazon Smile	18 members participating	\$ 25.53
King Soopers Community Rewards	15 members participating	\$139.64
Shop With Scrip	6 members participating	\$ 92.00

This money is used for in-house operating expenses. We encourage more members to sign up and help this "pot" grow. Information on how to sign up can be found by going to philoloveland.org, click on "members" in the header row, scroll down to the bottom of that page, and click on Amazon, King Soopers, or Shop With Scrip for the instructions.

The Colorado Gives online donation platform will be ready this summer for any Philo fundraising committee to participate. Committees will need to design their landing page for the Colorado Gives website – after their summer events.

Motion made by Beth Soderquist to accept this report was seconded by Linda Stangel and passed.
