

BUDGET news from the Philo Board & your treasurer, Peg Isakson

Hello from your Philo Board members, who have been working this summer on "Rethinking our Philo Budget". (Your treasurer, the Finance Committee, our CPA, and the Board). This fiscal year will be a trial year of using a budget layout typical of a 501c3 non-profit group.

WHAT DOES A NEW GENERAL FUND BUDGET PLAN MEAN FOR OUR MEMBERS?

- As in previous years, our yearly Income and Operating Expense plan is based on Dues, Donations, and Rebates.
- DUES are to be paid in September or October, using Check mailed to Philo. P.O. Box 484, Loveland, CO. 80539
 - ${\rm o}~$ Please write separate checks for separate committee donations.
- Cash or check brought to Sept 14th general membership meeting
- Zelle bank transfer app set up between your bank and our First Bank accounts.
- Square device at our meetings for credit card use (\$1.00 processing fee added.)

DONATIONS

Donations to Alternatives to Violence, Integrated Early Childhood, or the Scholarship committee can be made with a check, the Zelle app (PhiloGeneralZ@gmail.com) or the Square credit card reader.

In the past, many Philo members have written a check for their dues with an add-on amount donated for general operating expenses. That is still appreciated.

Donations to the fundraising committees for Dine Out With Heart or the Golf/Scholarship account will be made with a check, the Zelle app (PhiloDOWHZ@gmail.com) or the PayPal credit card reader.

REBATES

The Philo budget includes rebates from your "as-usual-shopping" through King Soopers Rewards, Amazon Smile, Shop With Scrip Cash Cards and also Duck Race Tickets. Check our philoloveland.org/members for more information about joining and using these rebate programs.

WHAT DOES A NEW GENERAL FUND BUDGET PLAN MEAN FOR OUR COMMITTEES?

Our proposed Operating Budget for the 2021-2022 fiscal year is based on \$7,330, an amount estimated from our Dues, Donations and Rebates. Each year we strive to keep our Internal Expenses within that amount proposed. As a reminder, dues were raised last year to ensure that all of our operating expenses would be covered by Dues, Donations to General Operating Expenses and Rebates.

Here's where we have something new for committees. This will be a trial year, with a comprehensive review in July and August, 2022. Your reflections and input will be valuable.

According to the Purpose statement in our By-laws, committees will be divided into External Service "to serve the Loveland/Berthoud community" and Internal Service " for the mutual improvement and fellowship of the members."

Our budget plan will relate to three areas:

1 - Business management - Overhead

State Licenses, Insurance, Taxes, CPA support, Site Rental, Mailings, Office Supplies, Printing, Website and Zoom licenses, Chamber of Commerce dues

2 - Internal Committees – *Fellowship and Communication of Members*: Digital History, Honorary Meetings, Newsletter, New Member Welcome, Publicity, Spring Appreciation Event, Sunshine, Website Maintenance, Winter Holiday Event

3 - External Committees – *Service to the Loveland/Berthoud Community*: Alternatives to Violence, Blood Drive, Food Basket Cash Cards, Canned Food Drive, Integrated Early Childhood, Scholarship Communications Committee, Golf Tournament/Scholarship Fundraising Committee and Dine Out With Heart Fundraising Committee

Budget continued...

Following nonprofit budget recommendations we are proposing a plan for setting aside some of the funds we currently have in the General Fund Bank account. An amount of \$14,660 (two years' worth of our income for operations plus end-of-year unused money) will be placed in a Philo Reserve Fund at First Bank. This money will be available to any Philo Committee that has formulated a plan to use additional funds at any time during the fiscal year.

When a committee asks for additional funds from the Reserve Fund, they will use the Request Form, submit it to the Board for approval, and will have access to that money within the month, without waiting for a new budget vote from the membership.

If you have questions or issues to share, please don't hesitate to contact any member of the Board. Questions will be gathered and shared at optional **Q&A Zoom sessions at 7 pm on September 10th and on September 13th**.

The Proposed Budget will be voted upon by the general membership on September 14th.`
