
As a fundraiser, we receive \$16.00 of the \$20.00 purchase price.

Excerpt from a Reporter-Herald article in 1962:

The speaker at a Philo meeting presented a program on modern education. She featured a teaching machine that has paper tapes that give out information to the students in routine drills such as spelling words and multiplication tables.

"The machines, the speaker declared, are no better than the program material fed into them and offer no magic solution in learning. However, she continued, knowledge may be acquired faster this way than any other way of self-learning. Many schools are trying the machines although they still are in the experimental stage. They will not replace teachers, she asserted, but will free them from the drudgery of the schoolroom and give them time to teach thinking."

The speaker pictured a hypothetical 1980 classroom with TV sets, UNIVAC machines, and a report card machine with tape-recorded answers to parents' questions. The UNIVAC machine would take care of math, a reading machine would take care of reading, and another would call roll and make out monthly reports. The superintendent would be replaced by an industrial engineer and the school board by a committee of efficiency experts.
