FROM THE SCRAPBOOKS

Excerpts from the *Philo Newsletter* of October 1, 1998:

"These are some of the memories shared by Eva Bliss and Lois Nicholson in interviews with Philo publicists Sue Ericson and Julie Padilla. Eva and Lois remembered that the club was the idea of the mother of Bernice Van Sant, one of the first members. Mrs. Van Sant wanted her daughter and friends to channel some of their teen enthusiasm and energy into good use and to keep up to date on cultural happenings twice a month in the evening.

The original club was much like a sorority, and Lois remembers being nervous about being voted on to be accepted into the group."

"Because many of the members did not work outside the home, they put much of their creative talents into programs to entertain each other. They took care of brief business at the beginning of each meeting, then moved on quickly to fun. Skits, musical presentations, and book reviews created a close knit group. The meetings were fun, social events. 'We wouldn't have thought of EVER missing a meeting,' reports Lois."

ALTERNATIVES TO VIOLENCE COMMITTEE

The Alternatives to Violence Committee invites you to the 6th annual Pastels on 5th that will take place on Saturday, September 10, 2016, from 10am – 5pm. This one-day free family-friendly event features sidewalk chalk art created by over 100 professional and amateur artists. There will also be live music, food vendors, an artist marketplace and a children's art area.

A business, corporation, church, school or individual patron of the arts sponsors each piece of sidewalk chalk art. Philo has purchased a 4x4 square. As sponsor of that square the Philo name will appear at the top of the piece. All money raised benefits Alternatives to Violence, which is committed to the intervention in, education about, and prevention of domestic violence, sexual assault, and other violent crimes.

This year only, Pastels on 5th is partnering with Project Self-Sufficiency (Loveland – Fort Collins) to bring "Girl Noticed", a nationwide charcoal mural project to Loveland. "Girl Noticed" is aimed at bringing awareness to the important role the female plays in our society. The mural "Girl Noticed" will depict a female that has been nominated from the community to be noticed.

With weather and over time the mural will naturally fade away, again to be forgotten. There is a window of time to "notice" the artwork, to "notice" the girl. All of the murals represent the message: "When an individual's talents, intelligence and character are left unnoticed, they may fade away, disappear, or be replaced and never be seen or developed into their full potential."

The Dine Out With Heart 2016 fundraiser is coming October 1 – 14! We are excited and hopeful that it will be a big success with 27 participating establishments, including 25 restaurants and 2 breweries which are ready to help Philo make this year's donations blow past the 2015 proceeds of \$13,000, which was almost double the 2014 proceeds of \$7000.

The committee has been diligent in contacting past and new establishments to participate. A special thanks to my co-chair, Diane McInturff. With her expertise and connections, she has raised the fundraiser and lowered my anxiety level several notches. The entire committee is what has made this 3rd annual fundraiser into a comprehensive Loveland event. My heartfelt thanks goes to the other committee members for their commitment and readiness to help. They are Kathy Loken, Betty Brammer, Diane Meuret, Eunice Holthesen, Pam Pellizzari, Jennifer Wilson, Sherry King and Jamie Powell.

Also, a special thanks to our future Eagle Scout, Tucker Ledbetter, for the 30 sandwich boards which the establishments will be using to display outside their front doors for advertising and Philo recognition. Another volunteer to thank is Rob Smith, the principal and creative director of solvvAgency, who is designing the inserts for the Reporter Herald advertising.

This year, the fundraiser has ten establishments giving a percentage of sales for one day or more. Wing Shack, Cactus Grill, Verboten Brewing, The Boar and Bull, and Loveland Aleworks are giving a percentage of the entire two weeks' sales during October 1 – 14. Refer to the website, [Dine Out With Heart Loveland](#), to get details on these particular dates and also on the meal or beer specials being offered by the 27 establishments. Special events being held is the kick-off by mo' Betta Gumbo on Monday the 3rd starting at 5 pm. The owner, Clay Caldwell, is hiring a band, donating a percentage of the proceeds, and requesting his 700 followers to donate a total of \$13,000, which matches the final 2015 proceeds. Saturday, October the 8th, is a pancake breakfast at Applebees from 8-10 am where half the proceeds will be donated. Then on Tuesday the 11th, Rock Bottom is featuring a taping of their new portal beer. Come for the opening ceremony honoring Philo by getting a free taster and then for the following four weeks, they will donate 25 cents for every beer of that kind ordered. Come celebrate the finale with Loveland Aleworks on Friday the 14th, who will be giving 50 cents of all Raspberry Sour beers, their favorite beer, for the entire 2 weeks....and the beer is **pink** for Philo!
