FROM THE PHILO SCRAPBOOKS

The first official Spring Style Show was held on April 19, 1948, with about 400 people in attendance. It continued to be a highly anticipated annual event until 1982.

Women, children and men were chosen from the community to model the latest fashions provided by local merchants. The newspaper covered the event in great detail, listing the models names as well as participating stores. Articles leading up to the show built anticipation. Traditionally, the theme wasn't revealed until the evening of the show.

As a fundraiser, admission of 50 cents was charged in 1948 and \$2.50 in 1982. Considering the time and effort to create a stage setting, recruit merchants and models, provide entertainment and refreshments, Philo members worked hard for their money. The 1961 annual Philo style show, "Fashion Fiesta" with a Spanish theme, was held on March 6, admission 60¢. Participating merchants included Bates Style shop, Duff's, Loveland Floral, Holiday Dress shop, Jack and Jill, Val Jean shop, Sir James Men's Wear, Leraas Fabric Center, Brown's Shoe Fit, Mock's Shoe store, McCauley's Jewelry and Tyler's Jewelry. Participants were invited to a silver tea following the style show. "Proceeds from the style show and the tea will be used to give emergency aid to needy families. Such families are helped throughout the year with food, rent, clothing, and other items as the need arises."

As downtown changed, these stores disappeared and were replaced by seven merchants from Orchards Shopping Center and only six merchants from 4th Street in 1982.
