

appreciation to the Golf committee for diligently earning money for Loveland community scholarships.

Last year we had a record 39 applicants, interviewed 23 individuals and selected 11 worthy recipients offering over \$17,000 in scholarships! Alberto, of Mountain View High School is attending Eastern New Mexico Community College in Auto Mechanics and Technology, Kobi of Ferguson High School is attending Longmont Community College becoming a certified G.I.S. Surveyor, and Sara, a recent graduate of Ferguson High School is taking classes at Aims Community College as a medical administration assistant. Our next 5 recipients are all single parents utilizing Project Self Sufficiency to attain further education for their benefit as well as their children. Heather is completing her courses at Front Range for her paramedic certification, Tifanie is at College America in medical specialties, and our final recipient, Kathy, was selected by her present employer, Palmer Florist, to receive education enabling her to a advance her career.

January is the time we begin to garner individuals that would benefit from our scholarships. Our guidelines are simple:

- * must be a Loveland-Berthoud resident,
- * scholarship is to be used for 2 year vocational or technical training,
- * must exhibit a financial need,
- * must have a goal and education plan in place.

Christmas Food Basket Committee

Many thanks to all those who shared their Christmas spirit by either delivering a food basket or donating to the cause during this past holiday season. Each year, I become more aware of the absolutely amazing group of women in the Philo organization, and how generous and good hearted you are.

There were a total of 267 families and elderly that received food baskets. There were 4 churches, 5 organizations and clubs, and 38 non-Philo community members that helped deliver baskets. As in the past, Philo had a wonderful participation rate from our members which included 91% active members and 60% honorary members. There were 147 Philo women that participated; 68 of those delivered one or more food baskets. The Food Basket Delivery committee delivered an additional 40 baskets and they were very short on committee members. Thank you to them. Considering the fact that this activity is not a "required" Philo responsibility, I believe that we had a great response.

I have been on this committee for 6 years and for the first time we had more recipients than donors. In fact, there were 66 more family names that we were not able to service. There are several reasons for this situation and I believe the troubled economy is one of the major reasons. House of Neighborley Services graciously offered to take those remaining names and provide them meals using their donors.

A special thank you to my committee members that were always willing to help in any way possible. They were: Pam Clifford – Co Chairwoman , Sue Lussenhop and Toni Wallace – honorary, Joan Putlock and Denise Olson – active and Marcia Goss – new member. I had a lot of fun working with you and appreciated your professional manner in which you handled all the many calls that you completed.

I would like to formally announce that next Christmas 2011 will be my last year as chair for the food basket matching committee. This service to the community is

one of the most outstanding events that we as Philo women accomplish and it has been a great honor to serve as chairwoman. I will do everything possible to help the next chairwoman with her transition. So far, there has been no one to step forward to accept this position.

Canned Food Drive Committee

We would like to thank all Philo members for volunteering in this year's Canned Food Drive. We did an awesome job keeping tables stocked and ready for basket shoppers.

On December 2nd and 3rd we collected 689 boxes of food from 20 schools in the district. The boxes were taken to the First United Methodist Church where students from Bill Reed helped unload and sort the food by category. On Saturday the donors (who volunteered to provide a Christmas Basket as provided by the Catholic Charities, Early Childhood Center and the House of Neighborly Service programs) filled 267 holiday baskets. The remaining food, 10,235 pounds was then distributed to the the Loveland House of Neighborly Service for use in their food program. High school students from Mountain View helped with those distribution and loading activities.

The food drive was a huge success this year, and we really appreciate everyone helping again for this year's drive. Remember this committee again next year, it is a very rewarding one to work on.
