

Nomination for Loveland Chamber's Non-Profit of the Year 2018

I wish to nominate the Loveland Philomatheon Club (known as Philo) for this award. The Loveland Philo Club is the oldest service organization in Loveland, started in 1918 by several girls that provided Christmas food baskets for needy families. The tradition of Christmas food baskets has continued with literally thousands of baskets given to families in need over the years. In addition to food baskets, the organization has an annual golf tournament as a fundraiser that provides scholarships for technical and community college students. Philo is a contributor to the Early Childhood centers in the Thompson School District, giving supplies and support to the program. Blood drives have been conducted several times a year to provide this most valuable asset to the Blood Center. Philo has recently begun a new fundraising venture, Dine Out With Heart, which partners with local restaurants to raise money for feeding the hungry in Loveland. In it's 4th Year, thousands of dollars have gone to alleviate hunger. Philo Club partners with other non-profit organizations to contribute to the community. They were one of the earliest supporters of Alternatives to Violence, sponsoring one of the apartments and continuing support throughout the years. Philo has supported Loveland Rotary's dictionary/chrome book program by selling tickets and supporting the Rotary Duck Race. They work with churches, middle schools, and House of Neighborly Service to conduct the Annual Food Drive that engages the community and furnishes food to fill the Christmas Food Baskets, and after the baskets are filled, they give all the extra food to the House of Neighborly Service. In support of the hundreds of past and present Philo members and their many years of dedicated service, I hope the Chamber will recognize the wonderful asset to Loveland that is Philo Club and help us celebrate our 100 year anniversary!

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
Dues and Assessments

ALTERNATIVES TO VIOLENCE

Have you been wondering how you can personally help women who need help in our community? One way is to attend the Philo Harvest Moon Gala in October and bring your friends! Another way is to bring needed items for ATV to our next two Philo meetings.

The money that we raise through the Harvest Moon Gala in October will go to support Alternatives to Violence transition housing program for victims of domestic violence. The transitional house has 4 apartments and provides a safe space for families for up to one year. Most apartments are rent free or no more than \$200 per month. During that time they also receive coordinated case management, advocacy and counseling. With Philo's support from the Gala they hope to pay the mortgage and insurance for one year.

The holidays are over but the need for many women continues. If you wish to help please bring any of the following items to the February 13 or March 13 Philo meetings.

- \cdot towels
- · cups
- water glasses
- \cdot water bottles
- · small plastic storage containers
- \cdot baby monitors
- \cdot full size face wash and moisturizer
- · mascara (brown, black)
- · full size toiletries (lotions, shampoo, conditioner, body wash)
- · kids toiletries (shampoo, lotion, powder, etc.)
- \cdot hair ties
- · sample sizes (from stores, hotels, dentist, etc.)

• Gift cards for bras (a woman may come in with no undergarments. The resident purchases a bra and underwear in their size and gives the receipt to case manager)


