

# DINE OUT WITH HEART

We are excited to formally introduce you to a possible new fundraiser called Dine Out With Heart. The board has approved this fundraiser and we will be presenting it at the January general meeting. After reading this article, if you would like to ask question or voice concerns, you are requested to come to the church between 6:00 and 7:00 p.m. to talk with Dona Menzies. If you are interested in being part of the 8 member committee please attend the January meeting or contact Dona. The board will be putting a time limit on the discussion at the January meeting. Philo will be voting on the proposal at the February meeting.

Dine Out With Heart is a fundraiser similar to what Fort Collins does with Great Plates of



Downtown. There is a website if you would like more information on their program. During the first two weeks of October, the downtown Loveland restaurants will be offering a \$25 meal deal. At the tables,

there will be table tents explaining Philo's fundraiser and purpose and envelopes will be provided for the patrons to donate any amount of money with the purpose of feeding families. Philo will be using these donations to totally fund the Christmas Food Basket program. It will also give us an opportunity to work with churches that are willing to help deliver the baskets. Churches have the workers to deliver but do not always have the funds to provide. Please see the following article for the full explanation of the program.

DINE OUT WITH HEART

#### **Proposal**

A new fundraiser called Dine Out with Heart is proposed. The Loveland residents with other communities are encouraged to patronize local eateries who will create a \$25 (price may vary) dinner deal for the first two weeks in October. The serving tables will be given pre designed envelopes provided by Philo for patrons to donate money to be used to fund the Christmas Food Basket program. Any overflow money is to be donated to other nonprofits that focus on hunger. This new fundraiser will require a newly established committee called, Dine Out with Heart. The motto is "A community without hunger is a community with heart".

#### <u>Vision</u>

The vision is that enough donated money will be collected to cover all cost of Philo members who participate in the Christmas Food Basket program. The vision is also to collect enough donations so there will be remaining funds that can be donated to other nonprofits that focus on hunger.

#### **Budget Needs**

The participating eateries will be asked to contribute \$50 each to help with advertising cost. Money needs to be budgeted for advertising with the Reporter Herald, posters for eateries to display, envelopes for the donated money, table tents to display on tables, websites, etc. Eateries will be encouraged to advertise Dine Out with Heart on their own websites.

#### **Donations**

The donations will first be used to cover all cost of the Christmas Food Basket program. This cost varies every year but is usually about \$35.00 for completed baskets for Catholic Charities and the Early Childhood recipients.

#### Committee tasks

Design team – create the poster to be used by restaurants and other appropriate locations, the donation envelope, and the table tent

Restaurant Team responsibilities – (8 members needed for 16 restaurants)

- Contact restaurants with information for participation
- Collect \$50 from restaurants required for participation and to be used for publicity
- Make sure the restaurant has given appropriate website information before deadline
- Keep restaurants supplied with enough donation envelopes and table tents
- Supply restaurant with advertising poster to be displayed
- During the 2 week event, pick up donations on Thursdays and Mondays and deposit at the bank
- Contact one other advertising locations such as grocery stores, library, etc., and supply them with poster
