CHRISTMAS FOOD BASKETS



We sincerely thank all of you who shared your Christmas spirit by either delivering a food basket or making a financial contribution toward

this program the past holiday season.

There were a total of 255 families or elderly individuals that received food baskets for 2014. Three churches, six organizations/groups/clubs, and 27 non-Philo community members helped deliver baskets or contributed financially. As in the past, Philo had wonderful participation by our members. 101 Philo women participated by delivering at least one basket or making a financial contribution. The Christmas Food Baskets Committee, with the help of several additional Philo women, delivered 25 baskets. In addition, our new community minded fall fundraising event, "Dine Out With Heart" provided further funding used to purchase gift cards for Philo women to use if they so desired to supplement the baskets they made and delivered. The fact that this activity is not a "required" Philo responsibility shows that once again 2014 was a highly successful year.

A special thank you to the Christmas Food Basket committee members who were always willing to help in any way possible: Dona Menzies, Pam White Trish Malik, Dianna Boehner, Heather Morrison, and Toni Wallace. You are wonderful women to work with!

The canned food drive of 2014 went well. We picked up 482 boxes from various elementary and middle schools. The Bill Reed middle school students worked very hard to unpack and sort all the boxes and got everything done despite the fact that their school was on a 2 hour lockdown.

Our members helped by sorting and straighten the categories, making sure everything was in the right place and by 4 p.m. everything was ready to go for pick up. We filled a total of 303 baskets for families and seniors here in Loyeland.

We have already met with the Food Basket Matching and Dine Out With Heart chairwomen to see how we can improve this experience for our members and several changes will go into effect next year.



HOLIDAY FOOD BASKET PROGRAM IN 1935

As we reflect on the success of this year's Christmas Food Baskets project, we should remember that this has been a long standing tradition for Philo.

The first reference to the food baskets that I found in the scrapbooks was in December 1935. A news article entitled, "PHILO GIRLS TO DISTRIBUTE YULE BASKETS TO 120 NEEDY FAMILIES," began with the words, "Once again...." So although our scrapbooks don't go back any earlier, this was not the first year of the food baskets.

The article goes on to say, "This evening they will leave Christmas baskets at the homes of needy aged persons as they make their rounds of the city singing Christmas carols and tomorrow afternoon will visit the needy boys and girls leaving them food, candy and toys."

The 45 Philo members spent approximately \$200, which were contributions of \$150 from the Rialto Theater, \$30 from their own fund, and \$25 in donations. The baskets contained a fresh roast, potatoes, beans, tomatoes, cereal, butter, rice, soup, apples, oranges, prunes, candy and toys. Rainbow Girls filled stockings with candy. Boy Scouts, Campfire Girls, and Young Business Builders gathered and fixed toys. Trucks were furnished by local car dealerships and the City of Loveland.

Philo also arranged a party for 24 girls in high school and the 8th grade who had need of assistance to attend school. Each girl was presented with "a useful gift."

The distribution of holiday food baskets continued to be a community effort with the Elks Club, the Rialto Theater, and other service groups for many years. Times change and the program has evolved into its present form. Of all the projects that Philo has sponsored over the years, this one is the most enduring.
