### Successful 2018 Philo/Thompson Schools Canned Food Drive

The success of the Philo/Thompson Schools Canned Food Drive was measured in smiles, numbers, and in the cheerful "thank you's" from volunteers. This year 19 schools participated in the drive with over 660 boxes distributed. Philo members helped with box delivery and pick-up, sorting cans, bringing snacks, organizing the tables, and boxing up cans for delivery to House of Neighborly Service. Community members who helped included 330 Bill Reed students, Mormon missionaries, and husbands and friends of Philo members. Exodus Moving and Storage coordinated the pick-up of boxes from twelve schools with the use of a large moving van and two of their workers.

Philo members, church members, and members of non-profit organizations gathered cans and packaged food for 200 holiday baskets.

Remaining cans and packaged foods from the Philo Canned Food Drive were donated to House of Neighborly Service.

The amount of food donated to HNS has increased in recent years.

In 2018: 7,474 lbs. of food were donated

In 2017: 7,364 lbs. of food were donated

In 2016: 5,790 lbs. of food were donated

In 2015: 5,271 lbs. of food were donated

Thank you to all Philo members who assisted with the canned food drive! Through your efforts and generosity, hundreds of families will enjoy a holiday dinner and filled panty.



## Early Childhood

Here's the news:

First and foremost thank you all for the donations of books and clothing to the Early Childhood Program at the Christmas Party. A great deal of thanks to Brianna Smith for the Barnes and Noble gift certificate that she acquired from RBB Architects. We are in good shape for the Christmas bag books but the gift certificate is needed for the annual April literacy fair. Again thank you!

Bags with books and some goodies for the teachers are assembled for each of the 24 Early Childhood classrooms and delivered to the Early Childhood Christmas Party on Dec.21. The clothing is divided between the 13 schools with Early Childhood classrooms based on how many classrooms are in the school. The staff at the Thompson School District is always very appreciative.

In August we delivered 140 school supply bags and Pete the Cat books with story board figures for 24 classrooms. 6 classrooms requested flannel boards which we made and delivered in October.

After the 1st of the year we will begin making sock puppets for some of the classrooms. Thank you to all committee members who put in their time shopping, assembling, and making things.
