## PHILO GENERAL MEETING MINUTES January 8, 2013

In preparation for the Task Force activity, everyone was asked to sit at a table representing a fundraising committee: Duck Race, Shopping Extravaganza, Golf Tournament, and Member Dues.

## WELCOME

President Sheila Pottorff read a quotation about forbearance, one of the six characteristics in Philo's motto, and how right now during our organization's changes, forbearance is key.
She thanked task force members: Joyce Krantz, Shellie Gutierrez, Miki Roth, Judy Grommon, Florence Doskansky, and Juanita Cisneros.
She thanked this month's hostesses: Eunice Holthusen, Eileen Huddle, and Diane Meuret.
She introduced guests Pam White and Karen Vinal.

## ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE-Tap Dancing

Dani from Mackinnon Royal Dance taught us about tap shoes and tap dancing, and we learned some tap moves.

## TASK FORCE

Shelia Pottorff introduced the activity. The chair of each committee facilitated a conversation about three questions:

- What are the successes of your committee and how do they support our mission statement?
- What are the challenges and barriers facing your committee?
- What other resources in the Loveland/Berthoud community could you collaborate with to optimize your service goals?
A recorder wrote committee responses on chart paper. At the end, each committee shared its responses.
- Shopping Extravaganza brought in $\sim \$ 2500$ and cover $2 / 2$ of committee expenses, supports friendship, and we don't have to organize it or find a location.
o The October timeline is hard to meet because our meetings begin in September, we have to pay for all tickets unaccounted for, and the store choices are dwindling.
o Let's look at what the Promenade Shops at Centerra could offer.
- Golf Tournament has gained a great reputation in the community for a well run tournament, it's women only, has raised $\sim \$ 90,000$ in 6 years.
o Moving the date to a week day may have hurt the turn out last year.
o Need to work on Sponsorship
- Duck Race services all $3^{\text {rd }}$ graders, supports fellowship, is a feel good project, we gain $60 \%$ of the sales, and publicity/printing is done for us.
o It feels like it is supported on the shoulders of our members, advertises for Rotary not Philo.
o Look into entering a big duck in the competition and advertise Philo, set up a booth at community events to sell tickets and represent Philo.
- Member Dues are low compared to other organizations and are used to cover administrative costs.
o Current dues are not covering the total of administrative costs, member numbers are down, and our 5013c status requires no fundraising dollars can be used for administrative costs.
o Have a "value pack" and roll Shopping, Duck Race, Dues all into one package, increase honorary status back to 25 years instead of 15.


## OFFICER REPORTS:

President, Sheila Pottorff no official report, but February will focus on Operational committees, the task force will meet again the end of January and report in February and consideration is being given to keeping current committee members in place (unless they really want to be on a new committee) through the '13-`14 club year, and role out the new committee responsibilities, etc for `14-`15.
