coming year, but I cannot accomplish the committee's charge without help. Please consider joining me to fulfill other responsibilities of the committee:

The Historian committee will be responsible for maintaining a record of all Philo activities. They will act as the club photographers and historical recorders. They will also be responsible for taking all new member pictures for the yearbook as well as updated active and honorary pictures as requested by members at the Spring Social or general meetings. At the end of the Philo year they will prepare a summary of the activities (most likely in some digital format) that can be shared with the membership at the Spring Social. They will also be responsible for archiving those pictorial records for future access.
