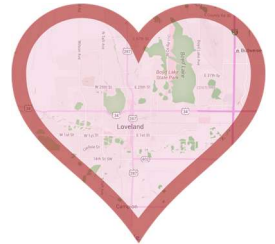
All our committees work with the best interests of the club in mind – even though many of the committees work behind the scenes, like the
