

### **Canned Food Drive**

To support the annual Philo Christmas food basket program, our canned food drive will be held at the First United Methodist



Church, 533 North Grant (Coy Hall) on Friday December 4th, and Saturday, Dec 5th.

Last year we provided food for approximately 250 baskets (a Christmas meal and a little bit more). We also donated 8000 pounds of canned and dried food to the Larimer County Food Bank and House of Neighborly Service. At an average of 1 1/4 pounds per meal per person, we have helped many people in their time of need. This year, all the remaining food will go to the House of neighborly Service.

#### WE STILL NEED A GREAT DEAL OF HELP

We are very short of members with trucks or vans to pick up the canned foods from the participating



schools (Thursday & Friday). We also need volunteers to work a shift helping us sort and organize the food. We will have Bill Reed Middle School and Mountain View & Thompson Valley-Key Club high school students help

with the sorting and heavy lifting on Friday and Saturday.

This is one of our events that requires help from all members to be successful. If you have not already signed up, please do so at the November general meeting or contact Sherry King at 669-0175 to volunteer. It is so important that we each give at least two hours to help the needy families of our community.
