### Open Letter to my Philo Sisters:

### Philo Trivia

Since we have embarked on a new fundraiser with Dine Out With Heart it is interesting to note some of the varied ways Philo has raised money to support our causes.

March 1936: Philo sponsored a benefit bridge party open to the public. Tickets were 20 cents or two for 35 cents.

<u>February 1940:</u> "BUY A TICKET TO THE PRESIDENT'S BALL TUESDAY TO HELP A CRIPPLED CHILD" Philo and the Lions were selling tickets.



November 1943: The club sold \$108 worth of tickets for the War Relief Show.

<u>August 1945:</u> Philo held a Tiny Tot Contest to raise money to be used for charity. To vote, money was dropped in jars at 32 stores who sponsored the children.

November 1960: Philo sponsored an artist's exhibition. A silver tea held at the exhibit "added a nice sum to the Philo club fund to fill Christmas baskets."

November 1962: The first Elks-Philo Bridge Benefit was a success with 130 participants.

March 1966: The 19<sup>th</sup> annual Philo style show sold nearly 1,000 tickets at \$1.00 each. The style show continued into the 1980's.

Some of you may remember other successful fundraisers such as the Holiday Boutique, the Home Tour and the Garage Sale. In more recent years we have funded our scholarships with the Women's Golf Tournament and had fun spending our money at the Shopping Extravaganza.

Funding our charitable endeavors has been a challenge since Philo's beginning. As times have changed, we have adapted our methods. The fact that we have continued since 1918 is a testament to the creativity, dedication, and resilience of our membership.

### Shopping Extravaganza Success!

On Saturday, October 18th many Philo members and friends came out to shop at the Outlet Mall's Shopping Extravaganza. It was a gorgeous fall day, perfect for shopping and enjoying the company of our Philo sisters.

The tally for what we earned for this fundraiser is below. Please notice the importance of those drawing tickets! If we do not meet our goal of 50+ ticket sales, we do not get to participate in the sales of the drawing tickets, and that can make or break this event's fundraising success for Philo.
