Runner obligations:

By Friday September 28: Deliver materials to your assigned businesses.

Monday October 8: Pick up the donation envelopes from the businesses and deliver to a committee member.

<u>Tuesday, October 9:</u> Deliver the server prizes and patron winner information on drawings offered by businesses.

Sometime October 17-21: Pick up all donation envelopes and fundraiser materials from the businesses and deliver to a committee member.

Sometime soon after <u>Thursday October 25:</u> Deliver server prizes and patron winner information on drawings offered by businesses.

Counter obligations:

Come Monday October 8 at 6:30 to Betty Brammer's home to open envelopes and count donations and/or come Thursday October 25 to open envelopes and count donations, same location and same time. Last year we opened over 800 total envelopes and had a blast doing so while drinking wine and laughing a lot!

As the fundraiser gets bigger and bigger each year, the committee will continue to need volunteers to help. Without additional volunteers, the committee members will have an unrealistic amount of work to make this fundraiser as successful as it can possibly become. Your help would be much appreciated.
