This year the House of Neighborly Services facilitated the delivery of holiday food baskets to 696 recipients. Liz Sethre matched 375 of those baskets, Philo Food Basket Matching Committee matched 176 and HNS took care of the rest. This Philo service project brings love and goodwill to over 500 needy people and provides another year of cheerful Christmas giving for hundreds of donors.

The Matching Committee received \$1990 in donations, which funded the 48 baskets that your Philo Food Basket Committee then purchased and delivered.

Solicitations were sent to a mailing list consisting of many current and past Philo members, along with previous donors, organizations, and churches. One in five Philo members responded to the mailing. Two in five responded to a phone tree. Thank you all!
