The canned food drive will be held at the First United Methodist Church, (Coy Hall), 533 North Grant Ave. on Friday, Dec. 12th, and Saturday, Dec. 13th. The food drive is the major support for the Christmas food basket program.

Last year, the drive provided food for approximately 200 baskets (Christmas meals, and a little bit more). 8,000 pounds of canned and dry goods were donated to the Larimer County food bank. At an average of 1 1/4 pounds per meal per person, we have helped many people in their time of need.


