We have filled the Layout Editor and Content Editor positions. We are still looking for someone to work in the new capacity of WEB/CIRCULATION EDITOR. This position's job description includes:

- Arranging updated information to be sent by contact person to Craig Robinson, our
 Web Page Originator and Technician. Updated information and respective contact
 person includes the Yearbook/Computer Tech., Philo Brochure/Publicity Chair, current 2
 forms of Philo's newsletter (members only and sanitized version), Layout Editor, and
 Committee information/respective Chairs, etc. (one time contact 1 hour total)
- This person will be responsible for mailing newsletters to those members who do not have access to the internet (approximately 12 people), and also use established guidelines to work on sanitizing past newsletters and sending them to Web Tech. to be displayed for public viewing. (8 times throughout the year 30 minutes per time to mail out 12 newsletters and approximately 45 minutes per past newsletter for sanitizing)
- This person will be responsible for mass e-mailings to send information to membership
 on an urgent basis as needed. (1 hour to initially set up e-mail addresses and 15
 minutes to mass mail information each time that it is necessary)

- March 27th <u>Halfbreed</u> by David Halaas the story of George Bent, the son of trader William Bent and his Cheyenne wife, Owl Woman.
- April 24^{th} <u>The Poe Shadow</u> by Matthew Pearl a historical thriller set in 1849 after Poe's death.
- May 22nd <u>The Pale Blue Eye</u> by Louis Bayard an award-nominated mystery thriller set in 1830 with Edgar Allan Poe as a cadet at West Point.
- June 25th (month may change depending on availability of the library book group bag) <u>Corrections</u> by Jonathan Franzen acclaimed literary novel of quirky characters and a satiric look at American life.
- July 24th <u>The Things They Carried</u> by Tim O'Brien 1990 finalist for both the Pulitzer and National Book Critics Circle award. Fiction that reads as a non-fiction collection of short stories about things U.S. soldiers carried in Vietnam.
- August 28th <u>Restless</u> by William Boyd a pedestrian Oxford student and teacher finds out that her aging mother was a spy in WWII and then is herself drawn into intrigue and danger.
- September 25th <u>The Book Thief</u> by Markus Zusak a tale told by Death of a young girl whose life is punctuated by the books she steals.
- October 23rd <u>Astrid & Veronica</u> by Linda Olsson a story of two neighbors in Sweden that is marked by lyrical prose and expert rendering of the themes of heartbreak and loss.
- November 20th <u>The Last Mrs. Astor</u> by Frances Kiernan a biography of the charming New Your society maven and philanthropist.
- December 18th Salad luncheon and selection of 2009 books. (no book discussion)

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
